Eugene R. Bonynge Memorial Graduate Student Scholarship

The Eugene R. Bonynge family and Woodland Centers sponsor a \$1000 annual scholarship award for a graduate student in the behavioral sciences. Eugene R. Bonynge, Ph.D., was Woodland Centers' Chief Executive Officer from 1995 to January 24, 2010 when he died unexpectedly. As the CEO of a rural community mental health center, Dr. Bonynge was acutely aware of the challenges recruiting and retaining mental health professionals.

The Eugene R. Bonynge Memorial Graduate Student Scholarship was inspired by a wish to honor his legacy as a behavioral healthcare professional, researcher and administrator, and the desire of the Bonynge family to contribute to the professional development of a graduate student with roots in Minnesota. Woodland Centers would like to aid in reaching the goals and aspirations of all individuals engaged in behavioral health studies. We have employment opportunities that may qualify individuals for government tuition reimbursement programs. Woodland Centers has a wide array of adult and youth programs and serves a seven county area. Qualifications of Applicants:

- 1. The applicant must be a US resident and have graduated from a high school in Minnesota (or participated in homeschool in Minnesota).
- 2. The applicant must be a student enrolled in, or accepted for enrollment in, a graduate training program in a behavioral science field which upon professional licensure would qualify as any of the following: Licensed Psychologist (LP), Licensed Independent Clinical Social Worker (LICSW), Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist (LMFT), or Licensed Practicing Clinical Counselor (LPCC).
- 3. Good academic standing (minimum required cumulative GPA of 3.0) in graduate program (or undergraduate program if not currently enrolled in graduate program)

How to apply

2. APPLICATION DEADLINE: May 19, 2023

How the scholarship recipient is selected:

- 1. Applications are reviewed by the Selection Committee (Woodland Centers' CEO; one Woodland Centers Board member; representatives of the Bonynge Family)
- 2. Incomplete applications will not be considered

- 3. Scholarships will not be awarded to applicants who are not qualified.
- 4. Preference will be given to applicants who express interest in rural mental health professional practice upon completion of graduate training.

How the scholarship award is made:

- 1. After the application deadline has passed, the Selection Committee will review the applications and make its selection by majority vote. In the case of a tie vote, the Bonynge Family Representatives make the selection.
- 2. The awardee will be contacted by mail and/or email in June or July
- 3. The awardee will be asked to receive the award in person (if possible) and participate in a photo with the Bonynge Family and Woodland Centers staff. The award will be dispersed at this time. If COVID restrictions do not allow this, a meeting will take place via video conference and the awardee will be mailed the award.
